PUBLIC NOTICE IN RESPECT OF ADDITIONAL LICENSING SCHEME INTRODUCTION OF AN ADDITIONAL LICENSING SCHEME IN THE CATHAYS COMMUNITY WARD OF CARDIFF

Notice

Notice is hereby given that Cardiff Council has confirmed the designation of an additional licensing scheme in respect of houses in multiple occupation covering the Cathays Community Ward of Cardiff Council. This scheme will be known as (Cardiff Council's Houses in Multiple Occupation Additional Licensing Scheme 2010) ("The Scheme"). The confirmation of the designation is in accordance with Sections 56 to 60 of the Housing Act 2004 ("the Act") and regulation 9 of the Licensing and Management of Houses in Multiple Occupation and Other Houses (Miscellaneous Provisions) (Wales) Regulations 2006.

The Scheme will be effective from

The designation was made at the Council's Executive Business Meeting on 4th March 2010. The Housing Act 2004 (Additional HMO Licensing) (Wales) General App 1st July 2010 and unless revoked beforehand will cease to have effect on 1st July 2015. The Scheme applies to all Houses in Multiple Occupation (HMOs) within the area described above except those exempted by the relevant sections of the Act.

Any landlord, person managing or tenant within the City should seek advice from Cardiff Council's Strategic Planning and Environment (Private Sector Housing) Service Area regarding whether a property is affected by the Cathays Community Ward Additional Licensing Scheme.

A person having control or managing an HMO in the designated area must apply to Cardiff Council for a licence.

Failure to apply for a licence is an offence under Section 72(1) of the Housing Act 2004 for which a person may be fined up to £20,000. In addition you may be required to repay up to 12 months rent collected during such time that the property was unlicensed.

For an application to be considered it must provide prescribed particulars and must be accompanied by the requisite fee.
